INTERESTING POINSETTIA VARIETIES

	<p>Golden Glo This bright, single-toned poinsettia has bracts in a unique gold colour, and complements the traditional red poinsettias for a festive red-and-gold combination. The yellow hue intensifies as the bract matures.</p>
	<p>Winter Rose Early Red The Winter Rose Early Red poinsettia is an interesting variety as its ruffled bracts are a contrast to the flat-bracted, big red poinsettia which breeders usually try to achieve.</p>
	<p>Premium Marble The Premium Marble poinsettia has dark green leaves and stands out among traditional poinsettias with its large, saturated creamy white bracts and a light pink blaze down the centre.</p>
	<p>Primero Red Glitter The Primero Red Glitter has elongated, deep red bracts with yellow speckles. This variety is popular due to its hardiness, as it is long-lasting in warm and low light conditions.</p>
	<p>Christmas Mouse While the usual poinsettia has pointed edges, the delightful Christmas Mouse poinsettia has soft-looking rounded leaves and bracts which resemble a mouse's ears.</p>
